Flightless Bird: Ostrich

They cannot use their wings to fly around. Instead they use their strong, powerful legs to run at fast speeds. They are the world's largest bird and can run at speeds of about 40 miles an hour. They can also run long distances for long periods of time. This is not always possible for fast runners, such as cheetahs, who need to take breaks.
